2019 Education District Program Agenda Highlights

Following previous attempts to return to the basics regarding what elected officials are required to do, TOI President Danny Hanning is endorsing a program to assist township officials across Illinois in learning important aspects of their job to their constituents and communities. We have put a great innovative program together for you assisting in your job as an elected township official.

Please note that there are two types of programs being offered this year. The Education District Programs are being held in March and have a slightly different agenda than the Regional meetings where afternoon and evening programs are offered to accommodate part time elected township officials in those respective areas of the state. The Regional meetings are being held in **Macomb**, **Danville** and **Mt. Vernon**.

Dr. Glenn Poshard is returning to the program this year and is the opening keynote speaker for both the educational district and regional meetings. His program on Understanding Leadership and Applying it to Personal and Professional Traits in Public Service is something every elected as well as township official should attend. This program will help you understand the type of leader you are and will allow you an opportunity to discover the difference between Being and Consciousness in your leadership traits. Dr. Poshard is a long-time friend of TOI and we are happy to have him return to be a part of our program in 2019.

We have two components to a program on Record Keeping in Township Government. Attorneys from **Sorling Northrop (Jeff Jurgens and Greg Mordock)** have a program that offers best practices in recordkeeping, agendas and procedures for accepting public comment for townships. Practices such as proper meetings minutes, notes and what is required by township clerks. Additionally, the later portion of this program has a representative from the Index Department of the Secretary of States office that will address the statutory provisions related to record retention for townships. Are you organizing and retaining all the records you need to be and in the correct format? This session will answer all these questions and more.

Returning to the program again in 2019 are attorneys from **Brown Hay and Stephens** in Springfield. We have had several inquiries about **Road Use Agreements** over the past few years. Township roads are being used more and more by overweight vehicles, sometimes in high volume, for large scale construction and utility projects. Townships have the authority to maintain, control, and provide reasonable rules and regulations for the use of their roads. Understanding the advantages and necessary elements of well-drafted road use agreements is critical for township officials. **Charles Davis** and others from **Brown Hay and Stephens** provide this program that great for everyone.

Keri-Lyn Krafthefer from Ancel Glink returns this year with an outstanding program on Building Relationships Among Township Boards. All the elected officials that serve on the township board are responsible to the statutory functions provided for by the Illinois General Assembly. Personalities are not part of the law. Understanding the different philosophies and problem resolving tactics important to having a successful board. This program talks about many aspects related to this and is a great addition to the program this year.

At the regional meetings held in **Macomb, Danville** and **Mt. Vernon** we have added a panel of representatives from each TOI's participating primary divisions to answer questions from the attending guests on a practice relative to the township board practices. This is an interactive program that is efficient and provides an opportunity to general questions by you the elected officials. We encourage everyone attending these programs to bring their questions with them. ... Remember the only odd questions are those that are NEVER asked!

Webinars allow trainers to share real-time audio, video, documents and other tools with attendees in various locations. A unique benefit of webinars is that they allow attendees to pose questions directly to the trainers. For TOI, webinars have expanded the organization's ability to provide its members with critical training and professional development relating to township government.

1. TOI Webinars Are Inexpensive
