IDOT's Technology Transfer Center is a part of a larger national program, the FHWA's Local Technical Assistance or LTAP program. There are LTAP programs in all 50 states and Puerto Rico. FHWA is conducting a survey to help them determine the strategic direction of the LTAP program. We are asking local agencies to participate in the survey. We emailed the survey out through our subscription service. A link to the survey will also be provided at the end of this article.

This survey is important because it will determine where FHWA places future funding for training and what types of training they encourage delivery of. Some of the survey questions ask about online training. Is there training you want to have delivered in person, or is online training more effective? When you consider online training, do you want online training where the training takes place at a certain time with a live instructor and group discussions or are videos that you can access when you want them more effective for your agency? Is online training accessible by all members of your agency that don't use computers as part of their job?

The survey also asks you to consider the future training needs of your agency. Does your agency have a stable workforce where you expect people to remain in the agency or is your agency facing retirements or turn-over? How does that affect your training needs?

Different jobs in local transportation agencies have different training needs and different possible suppliers. We hope the IDOT T2 (LTAP) program will continue to be an effective supplier for your training and technical support for your agency. We share information and course materials with the other LTAP centers, so the direction of the national program will influence our future direction here in Illinois.

We appreciate you taking time from your busy schedule to complete this survey.



HOW TO DEVELOP A PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE SAFETY ACTION PLAN



The FHWA Safety Office worked to update and re-issue the revised guide entitled, How to Develop a Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Action Plan, which helps State and local officials decide where to begin to address pedestrian and bicycle safety issues. The guide, issued fall of 2017, is designed to help agencies enhance their existing safety programs and activities, including identifying safety problems and selecting optimal solutions.

The guide also serves as a reference for improving pedestrian and bicyclist safety through a multidisciplinary and collaborative approach to safety, including enhanced street designs and countermeasures, policies, and behavioral programs. Engineers, planners, traffic safety, and enforcement professionals; public health and injury prevention professionals; and decision makers who have the responsibility

Simple objectives for what a Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Action Plan should accomplish include:

- Acknowledging the unique needs of pedestrians and bicyclists among road users and lay out clear, measurable goals for improving their safety.
- Being data-driven and based on a complete understanding of the safety problem.
- Taking steps to ensure that all members of the community have opportunities to provide their input, because the plan is a reflection of the community's goals and vision.
- Using audits and crash types to diagnose a safety problem accurately so that the policy, design, and behavioral interventions selected properly address the problem.
- Including specific recommendations for funding and supporting those recommendations with data or factual information.

The guide also offers options for funding strategies and a variety of other resources for planning and implementing identified countermeasures, projects, and activities. For more information, contact Tamara Redmon tamara.redmon@dot.gov.
